Introduction

Definition of religion:

This is the very essence of the first 2 commandments. God says **I AM** (vs1-2, therefore **YOU SHALL/MUST**(vs3-6). Today we will see:

- 1. Because I AM is unique, therefore you shall/must have no other gods before Him.
- 2. Because I AM is spirit, therefore you shall not make a graven image of Him
- 3. Because I AM is jealous, therefore you shall serve Him exclusively (those who do not, those who do are..).

Keep in mind:

- The 10 Words/commandments are **apodictic-**
- <u>Stated negatively</u>- indicating a people in ______ and under _____. Rom 7:7-8
- <u>Written in 2nd person singular</u>- "emphatic reminder to each individual within the community who heard the law of his responsibility to obey it, for the well being of ancient Israel depended on the obedience of individuals within the covenant community" (Huey, 85).
- The 10 Words serve as the <u>broad foundation</u> for the specific Law expounded on in Deut.
 12-26. As a result, they are not to be thought of in narrow terms of what is ______ and _____ but more broadly as each commandment points to the moral perfection which belongs to YHWH and is required by YWHW for all who would follow Him.

At Home:

Read Deut 10:12-12:7, 12:29-32-, 26:16-19

- Where do you see the first and second commandments? How are they communicated more specifically?
- What role does recalling God's past faithfulness in Egypt and the Exodus play in this explanation of the Law?

Read I Sam 5:1-8 and I Kings 18.

- How does YHWH demonstrate His power over idols in these passages?
- How do these mighty acts of God put the first two commandments on display?

Read Psalm 115:3-8 and Psalm 135:15-18.

- Compare and Contrast YHWH with the idols described in these passages.
- With the futility of man made idols so clearly stated in Scripture, why was Israel then and why are we now so prone to worship them?

Read Ezekiel 14:1-8.

- Though we usually set up idols in our hearts rather than in our homes, they are no less serious. What language does Scripture use to reveal the serious nature of idols in our hearts?
- What idols find a home in your heart? What do you believe they can do for you that God cannot or does not? (I Jn. 2:15-17)
- How does remembering what God did in Exodus 1-19 bolster your faith in YHWH and motivate you to obey the first commandment?
- Read **I Jn. 5:19-21.** Spend time in prayer confessing the idols which tempt your heart away from the One, True God. Thank God for all He is and has done for you in Christ. Recall how the first commandment comes from the Lord your God "who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage." Thank Him that His commands come from grace!
