For Further Reflection/Application: *Lord help us to be doers of the Word and not just hearers!*

What is the most important thing you heard today? How were you encouraged, challenged, and/or convicted? What do you want to study further as a result of today's message?

Therefore, dear Jesus, since I cannot repay You,/ I do however adore You, and will ever pray you. think on Your pity and Your love unswerving/not my deserving.

What songs besides Ah holy Jesus, how have You offended go well with today's sermon?

Is this how you view the trial and crucifixion of Jesus? Do you understand that it was your sin (and mine) that made the death of the Son of God (incarnate) necessary? Note Romans 3.

What are some ways Christian disciples deny the Lord Jesus Christ today? What are some ways you have (regrettably) done so? What are some of the reasons believers are tempted to distance themselves from Him?

How did Peter respond to his denial of Christ? How did Judas respond to his treacherous betrayal of Christ (note 2 Corinthians 7:10 and the verses listed below).

What passages of Scripture highlight the main points from today's exposition? For example read Psalm 130:3-4; Psalm 32; 1 John 1:8-2:2. 2 Corinthians 7:10.

Before the all-knowing Christ alone, if the Lord were to make public your most embarrassing sins (before and after your conversion), what would be listed? Be careful not to throw stones at Peter in a glass house.
