For Further Reflection: Lord help us to be doers of the Word and not just sermon connoisseurs!

Does it matter if someone attempts to separate *facts* from the *truth*? Note John 20:30-31; 21:25; Luke 1:3-4; and 1 Corinthians 15:1-8. Is the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus (historic) fact or fiction? Is saving faith in Christ divorced from all reason? What difference does it make?

On this subject, Dr. Sproul notes, When the Scriptures say that faith is the evidence of things not seen, what are we to understand that to mean? The example given is that by faith we understand the world was formed by the Word of God. None of us was an eyewitness of the miraculous action of God in creation. Yet we trust that the universe has come into being by the act of God's divine work of creation because we have come on reasonable grounds to believe that God's Word is trustworthy and true. Because we are convinced that God's Word is trustworthy and that that conviction is a reasonable conviction, we can trust God's Word even for those things that we cannot see. One prominent theologian also argued the point that true faith is not believing against evidence. Rather, true faith involves trusting in the evidence that God has amply provided in and through His Word. That faith is not without what Calvin called evidences; rather, it is a faith that surrenders to or acquiesces to the evidences.
