For Further Reflection: Lord help us to be doers of the Word and not just sermon connoisseurs

What is the most important thing you heard today? How were you encouraged, challenged, and/or convicted? What do you want to study further as a result of listening to today's message?

Christians celebrate "Good Friday/Communion" throughout the year (as we should). Sadly, we often confine Resurrection-themed sermons and songs to once a year at Easter. Why would it be profitable to celebrate the empty tomb more often than we often do?

Add the following Resurrection songs to your playlist and let me know in a few weeks how this impacts your daily walk. Note: *Hail the Day!* Sovereign Grace; *Christ the Lord is Risen Today;* Hymn. *Christ Arose! (Lo in the Grave He Lays);* Hymn. *Because He Lives (AMEN); See What a Morning!* Getty music. *Was it a Morning Like This?* Sandi Patty *Christ Our Hope in Life and Death.* Getty music. *Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!* Getty music. *All Hail the Glorious Christ!* Sovereign Grace. What are some other resurrection hymns/songs that you enjoy?

Memorize Romans 10:9 and 1 Corinthians 15:3-4. Note Acts 1:3.

The LORD chose both *female* and *male* disciples to bear witness to the most important event in history! All believers are called to share the gospel message today as well as via local outreach and personal evangelism! *"You shall by My witnesses*!" According to Matt. 27 three major obstacles stand in the way of the empty tomb being a "body burglary." What three "S's" were mentioned during the sermon? The tomb of Christ is empty but not because someone stole Jesus' body. The tomb is empty but not because Jesus wasn't really dead. That's also a foolish lie! The historic resurrection is confirmed by many facts and witnesses! Note 1 Cor. 15:1-11.

A theologically misinformed believer is often a very confused disciple. How is this illustrated in John 20 and how is this seen today in the contemporary church? (Note Eph. 4:11-16)

Our church prayer chain includes many health concerns, various sicknesses, and death notices. What are some of things that you've heard about lately within our church family? What are some of your own physical struggles or health ailments that you're going through? How does Christ's *bodily* resurrection (John 20) bring hope and encouragement to beleaguered believers? (note 1 Cor. 15:20-49) Keep in mind that the true gospel involves the redemption of body and soul!

The Unexpectedly Spectacular Burial of King Jesus Underscores 3 Timeless Truths:

1) <u>The Wonder of God's Sovereign Majesty</u>! (*John 19:38-39*; Isaiah 53:8-9; Matt. 10:29-30; Acts 4:26f)

2) <u>The Courage of Genuine Discipleship</u>. (*John 19:38-40*; Acts 4:31; Luke 9:23-25; Colossians 4:2-3)

3) <u>The Majesty of Jesus' Royal Burial</u>. (*John 19:39-42*; Isaiah 53; Matthew 12)

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
