When we say, "the God of the Bible has a Son." What do we mean? What do we *not* mean? Why does the Word of God make such a big deal out of this? (John 20:31; 1 Jn 2:20-25).

John has been called, 'the Gospel of the Savior's Sonship." What's unique and glorious about Christ's Sonship? Read Mark 1:1/Mark 15:39 and then read John 1:1, 34/John 20:28-31.

Jesus' Sonship is of first-rate importance and impacts salvation, sanctification, evangelism, apologetics, missions, and worship (explain).

Most people in the world do not embrace what the Bible teaches concerning Jesus Christ, the Son of God. What do Mormons, Muslims, Jehovah Witnesses, and Liberal "Christians" wrongly believe and teach concerning Jesus, Son of God? How do they misinterpret and misapply this title? When is the last time you shared the Gospel with an unbeliever?

What were some of the practical points of application highlighted during today's sermon? What additional practical implications would you add?

What Bible verses highlight Jesus' presence and activity in eternity past? How does this relate to the believer's life today? Note 17:24; Jn 15:9; Romans 8:31-39; Eph. 3:14-19 (esp. verses 18-19).

What role did the Son play in creation? How is He different from all created things?

What did the Son do during the Old Testament era? What is an O.T. Christophany? Note Genesis 15; Joshua 5:13-15; Judges 6:11-18; Isaiah 6; Daniel 3:25.

What is special and important about the Son's birth/arrival, His baptism, His mountaintop transfiguration, His bloody and torturous cross and his empty tomb, His active ministry in the present church age; and His role in the future age to come?

What songs celebrate the truths highlighted in our current series? Note Chris Tomlin's, "Jesus, Son of God." Getty, Matt Boswell & Matt Papa, "Christ The True and Better Adam."

The term "Son of God" underscores both unity and distinction within the purview of Trinitarian majesty and mystery.

To better appreciate and understand John's purpose statement/Gospel (Jn 20:30-31) let's examine Jesus' Sonship under the following headings:

- 1) Acknowledging the Current Confusion.
- 2) Establishing the wide range of meaning of both 'S(s)on' and 'S(s)on of God.'

The word "Son" or "S(s)on of God" is applied to no less than six different "beings."

- 3) Noting the Frequent Usage and Meaning of this Most Important Christological Title.
- 4) Appreciating the Practical, Personal, & Theological Significance of this Majestic Yet Oft Misunderstood Title.
- 5) Avoiding the Interpretative Pancake Mistake.

Be careful not to flatten out the meaning of the text. Do not import the meaning of one passage unto another passage of Scripture.
